Plans for 230+ new homes

Igloo the company behind The Malings in Ouseburn is this summer working towards a double launch.

First up is the build-start of its townhouses and workspaces at Steenberg's Yard on the opposite riverbank to The Malings.

Secondly, Igloo will be publishing its plans for another 230+ new homes,

commercial premises and more workspaces for its remaining riverside sites. Malmo Quay next to Mariners Wharf, Glasshouses the grass bank between the Tyne Bar and Free Trade Inn, and Spillers' Quay will be part of a new urban village to be created within the spirit of Ouseburn Valley. Cycle Hub and Ouseburn Boat Club will both have new homes in the scheme plans to be announced.
