We are sure that you will have all seen the media coverage of the proposed planning development for a 140 metre high big wheel with the associated visual screen and the assembly of buildings including visitor centre and leisure and hospitality

Erection of a 140m high (112m diameter) steel framed observation wheel with 60 cabins, a five storey visitor centre/wheel terminus (6790 sqm) comprising food, beverage and merchandising outlets (sui generis), 3 x two storey buildings (2940.3 sqm) comprising food and beverage units (Class A3 to A5) and a three storey family entertainment centre (10,771 sqm) (Class D2) with associated parking (171 spaces), cycle parking, servicing, hard and soft landscaping and other associated works.
